<u>"THIS MONTH 150 YEARS AGO"</u>

EAST

June 3, 1863 General Lee, with 75,000 Confederates, launches his second invasion of the north, heading into Pennsylvania in a campaign that will lead to Gettysburg.

June 9, 1863 "Battle of Brandy Station" The largest cavalry battle on American soil pitted Major Gen. Alfred Pleasonton (US) against Major Gen. J.E.B. Stuart (CS). Brandy Station is the first battle of the war's most famous campaign – Gettysburg.

WEST

June 7, 1863 "Battle of Milliken's Bend" was one of the earliest battles where African-American troops fought. In this battle, the majority of the Union forces were composed of black troops.

June 18, 1863 Major General John McClernand is relieved of command by Ulysses S. Grant for insubordination.

CIVIL WAR FACT

Hardtack (also called 'sea biscuit') is a simple type of cracker or biscuit, made from flour, water, and sometimes salt. Some hardtack used during the Civil War had been stored from the 1846–8 Mexican-American War. It appears that it was first called hardtack by the Union Army of the Potomac. Although the name spread to other units, it was generally referred to as hard bread by the armies of the West.
